Saving Time


Depending on your job classification, your FLSA/Comp time will be "paid out" at certain times. While this is good for spending on fun things such as food, gas and kids, there may be times when you need to "save your time" for an upcoming surgery, trip, etc.

State Office requires "saving time" to be approved locally by Linda and then routed to the Associate Commissioner, Laura Cazabon-Braley for approval. Once approved, it is submitted to our Time Administrators so they know not to include you on the monthly payout.

To request saving your time, please ask you immediate supervisor to send your **name**, **EID**, **brief description of why you are saving the time** and **how long you wish to save time for** (in months) to Linda Hinshaw & Jeff Goza. The request will be reviewed and then your supervisor notified of the decision.

Changes to Campus Roads

As part of our on-going changes to help protect those that live here, Maintenance is adding fencing to the back section of campus. This will basically isolate the outside storage areas but also close access on South 24th & Lakeside. To get to OWT, you will enter OWT Drive from Lakeside on the south:



You will not be able to go past
Maintenance (on 24th) or past OWT Drive
(on Lakeside). This is a permanent change.

Required Training

The various trainings (both in-person & iLearn) we are required to do is getting lots of attention from State Office and others. The requirement that everyone be **100%** up to date will be watched closely with actions taken to ensure it's done.

We are now moving to a 11-month cycle – basically everyone will be required to be one month ahead in training. This means all August training is due in July, September is due in August, etc.
